The Role of the Tutor



- The form tutor will play a pivotal role in your child's school life.

- All homework is set through our online portal – ClassCharts.
- You will receive your ClassCharts login in your first week in September.
- You will be set 30 minutes homework, per subject, per week (except for subjects where you are only seen once per fortnight)
- You may submit your homework online through ClassCharts or hand in physically (the teacher will give their expectation).
- You can contact your teachers through the messaging function in ClassCharts, if you need help.

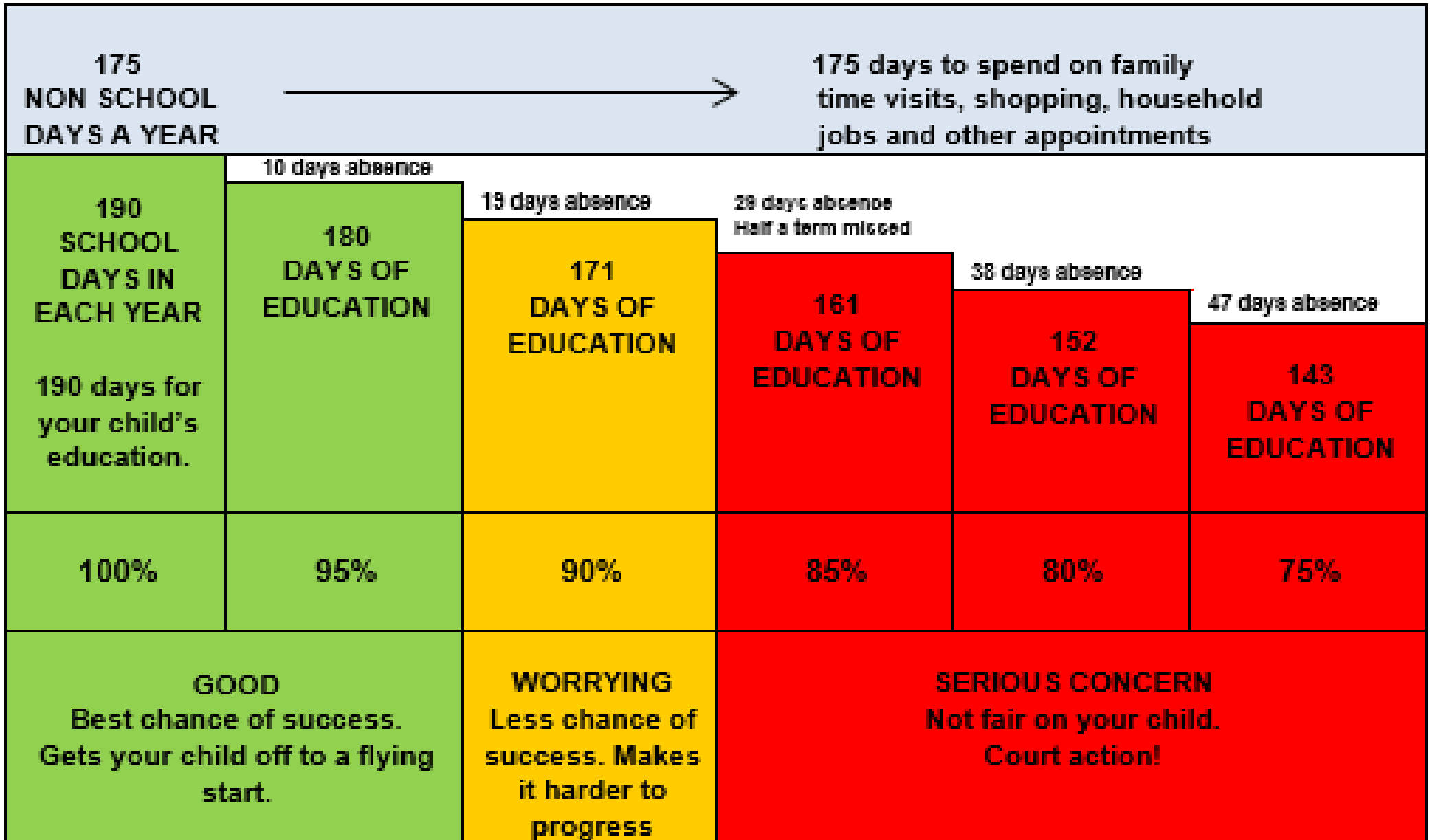


Attendance
